We've had such a *lovely* week filled with curiosity, creativity, and fantastic learning!

As Artists...

The children have been exploring the work of Andy Goldsworthy, particularly his beautiful spiral designs made from natural materials. We practiced drawing our own spirals, looking carefully at shape, pattern, and flow. The class showed wonderful focus and creativity—our sketchbooks are looking brilliant!

As Historians...

We have been investigating the Royal Family tree. The children looked closely at how different members of the royal family are related and discussed how family trees help us understand historical connections. They were great detectives, spotting patterns and links across generations.

As Scientists...

Our science work this week has focused on the properties of materials. The children explored what makes a material suitable for different purposes and applied this thinking to rockets! We compared materials to decide which might be the most effective and why—there was lots of great reasoning and super scientific vocabulary being used.

It's been a busy, exciting week of learning, and we're very proud of the children's enthusiasm and teamwork.

Croft (Year 3 -Year 6)

✍ As writers we have started to write our Newspaper Reports based on a well-known fairytale. The children have really enjoyed turning some famous characters into villains such a Red Riding Hood or making Jack the villain, breaking into a poor, innocent giant's house and stealing his prize possessions.

📘 In whole class reading we are looking at the text 'Viking Boy.' It can be quite gory in places, but the children have really enjoyed following the main character Gunnar as he goes on a quest for his father. It also links nicely to our topic Vikings in History.

💻 In computing we continue to use the programme Scratch. They have learned how to move, rotate, change colour and backgrounds. This is all to gain an understanding of coding and how to create similar programmes.

📅 As Historians, we learnt about Viking trade. We discovered that they would acquire items during raids on villages, which they could then use to trade around the world.

🍴 Cooking Club was another success this week, with the children making some delicious fruit skewers. We definitely have some budding chefs in Croft class. Look at the photos below to see their creations.
