

To celebrate Geography Awareness Week we went on a very chilly, but very lovely 'Welly Walk.' We made some predictions beforehand about what we might see, then compared these with our actual findings. It was wonderful to be out in nature to celebrate Geography.

In Maths, Y3 have been looking at complements to 100, this is a handy way to subtract large numbers. The method involves counting to the nearest 10, then to the nearest 100 and adding the 2 numbers together. Year 5 & 6 have been learning how to multiply and divide by 10, 100 and 1,000.

In English we are coming to the end of our Journal, Roman Diary. The children are really looking forward to rewriting Day 6 of what happens when Iliona and her brother Apollo are sold as slaves in Rome.

In Forest School we made flatbread with honey and jam. They were absolutely delicious. Some of the children also made bows and arrows using sticks and string.
